Theology From My Cat

Dear MBC Family;

I am astounded when I hear non-believers scoffing at the idea of there is a God. A Supreme Sovereign Being who created and set everything into motion and, furthermore, gives a rip about you or I. But the truth be told, His fingerprints are everywhere; God has not hidden Himself. Romans 1:20 informs us, "For since the creation of the world His invisible attributes are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse." (NKJV)

This brings me to the point of this writing. This past week I had to say goodbye to one of my best friends; no, Cynthia is just fine...I'm talking about Sebastian our cat. I know, for some people you may ask, "What's the big deal?" Well, Sebastian had been a part of our family for the last seventeen years. He and I had an inseparable bond. As Cynthia would often comment, "He is definitely your cat". I have come to realize that that "hairy little heathen" taught me more emotionally about God and our relationship with Him than three years of seminary ever did.

First, let's talk about unconditional love. I think pets are the closest to true unconditional love that we will ever encounter in our earthly lives. Have you ever accidentally stepped on your pet or scolded them to have them run off and sulk for a little bit...but usually sooner than later back they come to sit in our laps, or be by our- - all has been forgiven. What that represents in the smallest way is the unconditional love God has for the greatest of His creation. Don't misunderstand me, God does not love our sin...in fact it grieves Him. But despite all our wrong doings and betrayals He still loves us as much as ever. With outstretched arms it is He who waits for us to climb into His lap and love Him.

Second, we are accepted just the way we are. I could come home sweaty and smelly and Sebastian was just as happy to see me as he would be if I had just stepped out of the shower. God is just the same way. Now, let me be careful here. When we come to God with a repentant heart He will gladly accept us in whatever condition we may be in. Despite our external condition, with a heart that is repenting of sin He longs for us to jump up into His lap and freely express our love and appreciation of Him. In fact, He is the One who can cleanse us of any filth.

And last, the seventeen years we had Sebastian was an incredible gift from God Himself. God allows people, places, and things in our lives for a reason. Sometimes it is to teach, sometimes to be taught, and sometimes just for sheer happiness. I do not believe things happen randomly or simply by coincidence; everything exists and occurs through the sovereignty of God for a purpose which will ultimately glorify Him.

So I must admit a bit of humility when I acknowledge the wonderful things that Sebastian taught me about God. Perhaps this is a little bit silly for some, but it has been eye opening for me. Besides, if God can teach from the mouth of a donkey, why couldn't He teach from a little white cat? Goodbye and thank you Sebastian!
